The Breaking of the Bread

The first section of the Gospel reading for this Sunday ends simply with, “Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.”

The breaking of the bread in this Gospel can be an action embodying the goodness of God and it certainly has Eucharistic connotations. But what jumps out to me, however, is that there is something so beautifully ordinary about this moment. The ordinary bread was broken in an ordinary house at an ordinary meal. And it was only in this ordinary, yet warm and familiar act that the two disciples were finally able to recognize the One with whom they were sharing bread.

The Scottish theologian William Barclay suggested that these two followers, these disciples, were present with Jesus near Bethsaida to witness the miracle of Him feeding the five-thousand. And it was because of this that when He broke the bread at their humble meal they recognized His hands again, and then were able to truly realize just Who it was that shared their meal.

My prayer for us as we continue through this glorious Easter Season is that we do not take for granted all of those *ordinary* moments that fill our lives; those times we share with friends and loved ones. Whether they be on walks, quiet moments at home, conversations over a cup of coffee, and yes, especially when we break bread together, it is important that we recognize those beautiful, ordinary moments, and invite Christ into them and also recognize His presence there.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, "If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!" As a lifelong late-arriver, it's something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the "it counts" is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous "Road to Emmaus" story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: *Word*, followed by *Eucharist*. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as he connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus' presence in the "breaking of the bread."

With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that's precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word so that we know him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too!



Family Family life is strengthened through story-telling and shared meal times. In a similar way, Christian life is sustained by God's word in Scripture and by Christ's presence in the Eucharist. We are especially sustained in our faith through our weekly celebration of Mass. Today's Gospel reading reminds us that the Scripture and the Eucharist are given to us so that our acts of bearing witness to Christ might be strengthened. As you gather as a family, ask each person to share their favorite story about your family. Talk about the importance of these memories about your family life and the importance of the meals you have shared together as a family. Recall that these stories and meals strengthen the love you share. In a similar way, our Christian life is strengthened by sharing God's Word and the Eucharist at Mass. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 24:35-48. Discuss the mission that Jesus gave to his disciples after their shared meal. The Eucharist also sends us to be Christ's witnesses in the world today. Conclude by praying together that we will be strengthened by God's word and by Jesus' presence in the Eucharist to be witnesses to Christ. Pray together *Tantum Ergo* or today's psalm, Psalm 4.
