There is a very common misconception that is sometimes inferred from the last few words that Jesus speaks in the Gospel this week as noted in the third chapter of Mark. He says:

“Who are my Mother and my brothers? And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

And if anyone gives this a mere cursory glance at this Gospel section without context they might think Jesus doesn't care about His mother or His immediate family; that he is excluding her and them in some way.

Sadly, this kind of shallow reading of this part of scripture has led many to dismiss the importance of the Blessed Mother and to downplay her role in our Christian faith; her fiat and all that entailed. One might ask why they should hold her in such high esteem?

But He's not dismissing her at all. As the good Teacher that He is, He's challenging His listeners, challenging us, to think and to learn. He is not casting away His mother and family, but instead with His words He is inviting the rest of us to join His family. He is not discounting or dismissing, He is inviting.

We are part of a family, us Christians. He called us to be a part of it. My prayer is that we realize that, and that we can also understand how we are caught up in that ultimate relationship of The Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That we can realize how we are in God together with each other and our Blessed Mother and all the saints; family.






