The people in today's Gospel, who heard Jesus preach and saw the great things he could do, are pretty typical of all of us. **We, too, often cannot find the goodness in one another.** We prefer to judge by appearances, or by society's standards, rejecting those who do not match our expectations of what an important person, an attractive person, an intelligent person, should be.

It takes someone special to find the goodness that exists in others. Maybe we are afraid of appearing inferior if we do so, or maybe we're so "busy" in our heads that we just don't even take the time to look.

Here is an interesting story about a king who knew he was about to die. He wondered, *"Which of my two sons should I leave in charge of this kingdom?"* He wanted to find out which son would be a benevolent and loving caretaker of his people.

He called his older son and told him to search throughout the kingdom and find one good person to bring to him. For over a year, the son searched out all the kinds of people whom he thought might be good. He talked to teachers, doctors, nurses, farmers, holy men--in his estimation, all successful, attractive people. But with each person, he found some defect in their character, personality, or behavior.

Finally, he came home to his father and said, *"I have been searching throughout the whole kingdom. I have talked to every kind of person one would expect to be good, yet I could not find a single truly good person to bring to you."*

The king then called his second son and asked him to find a truly bad person. The son went to all the places one would expect to find a bad person--gambling and drug dens, prisons filled with violent persons. But the more he talked to each person, and the more he listened to them, he found, underneath their faults, bad habits and flaws, something good, albeit very small.

After a year of searching, he gave up and returned home. He apologized for being unable to find a truly bad person. To his surprise, his father embraced him, saying *"My son, you are capable of finding the tiny gem that exists in everyone. You are worthy of being the next king"*

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Recently I watched a bunch of YouTube videos on how to optimize willpower in the face of weakness. The message was: do not accept your weakness. Crush it. Dominate it. In one video, however, at the end of a rant by a willpower coach, the muscular stoic admitted, "You'll never actually get what you want, no matter how hard you try." Amazingly, he admitted that willpower alone is not sufficient for us weak-willed humans.

What does God want us to do with our weaknesses, if crushing them with willpower won't work? For example, what should I do with my tendency to arrogance and self-isolation? Or my procrastination? Or my intellectual and physical limitations? Or my selfishness?

The counter-intuitive answer is clear in this week's words from St Paul, "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me (2 Cor. 12:9)." Boast of our weaknesses? Paul isn't promoting weak-mindedness or laziness. Rather, he perceives that Jesus loves us not despite our weaknesses but because of them. Boasting of our weakness means claiming human will is not all we have. It means turning to God whenever we feel weak, which-let's face it-is almost all the time. When we do, we learn to love our weaknesses, because it's there that we meet the strength of Christ. This week, I challenge us to find ways to boast not in willpower but in weakness.

Our family plays an important role in shaping us and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. But sometimes the influences from outside our family can make us unrecognizable to those who know us best. These outside influences can lead us away from God, or they can lead us toward a deeper relationship with God. In today's Gospel, we see that the people of Nazareth could not recognize Jesus as the Son of God. They could know him only as the son of Mary. We hope that through our family life we will be encouraged to filter the many influences on our lives through the lens of faith so that we will become the person that God calls us to be. As you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Acknowledge that many of these people and events are positive influences, helping us be better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. Also acknowledge, however, that there are negative influences in our lives that risk pulling us away from God. Observe that Jesus was a person who allowed his relationship with God to be the most important thing in his life. This led many people to have faith in him as the Son of God. However, not everyone could recognize this about Jesus. Read today's Gospel, Mark 6:1-6. Ask: Who does not recognize Jesus as God's Son in this Gospel? (some of his kinfolk in Nazareth) Observe that because of the people's lack of faith, Jesus could not perform many miracles in Nazareth. Conclude by praying together that our families will continue to help us follow God in our lives. Pray together the Prayer for Vocations.



God, in Baptism you called me by name and made me a member of your people, the Church. Help all your people to know their vocation in life, and to respond by living a life of holiness. For your greater glory and for the service of your people, raise up dedicated and generous leaders who will serve as sisters, priests, brothers, deacons, and lay ministers. Send your Spirit to guide and strengthen me that I may serve your people following the example of your Son, Jesus Christ, in whose name I offer this prayer. Amen.
