
## JULY 14, 2024

One of my greatest joys is an evening walk. My Italian Grandma called this beautiful twilight stroll a “*passeggiata*.” A *passeggiata* is a leisurely walk that usually takes place after dinner. It is a time to settle your stomach and your mind, a time to think about the day. It is an opportunity to converse and try to solve the problems of life in a good light, a time to silently give thanks for the blessings received. It is a time to relax and hopefully have a conversation with the family and friends who may be present or encountered along the way. But if company is not available, walking alone is very fine too.

I take my evening wanderings religiously on my day off, usually accompanied with a beagle named “Charlie,” and I also try to get it in at the parishes as well. It is on these walks that I witness the reality of life as it is played out here in our towns; the losses, the wins, the ups and downs. I see kids playing in the streets, I see family gatherings, I see fights, I see accidents, I witness life.

In this Sunday’s Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to do something similar. He tells them to go out walking, two by two. And in that way He asks them to minister His people; He is asking them to take a simple *passeggiata* and encounter those He wishes to save. Perhaps we could do the same in our walks in life, using not only the literal evening walks, but every moment in our daily lives, to bring the light of Christ to the World.






Families who work together to accomplish routine household tasks know that the benefits are more than efficiency. In sharing daily tasks, we accomplish more, but we also build relationships that last—and it's a lot more fun! Jesus sent his disciples in pairs to minister in his name. Perhaps the job was accomplished more effectively this way, but more importantly, Jesus' mission was accomplished more authentically. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it.

As you gather as a family, talk about some household tasks that are more easily accomplished when two or more people work together. Talk about how working together not only makes the job easier, but also makes the task more fun because we are able to spend time together. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:7-13. Ask: Why do you think Jesus sent out his disciples in pairs? Observe that Jesus continues to give us a community with which we share our life of discipleship—our family and the community of the Church. Conclude in prayer together that we will continue to rely on the support of the community of the Church in our life of discipleship. Pray together the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.
